Prof Kim Mulholland

Professor Mulholland is an Australian paediatrician with extensive experience in research leading to or evaluating the introduction of new vaccines in the developing world. Between 1989 and 1995 he lead the Haemophilus influenzae type B (Hib) vaccine research program in the Gambia, which involved three Phase 2 trials of Hib vaccine, a maternal immunization study and a large Phase 3 trial.

Between 1995 and 2000 Professor Mulholland worked at the World Health Organization (WHO) in Geneva, assisting with the design and oversight of Gambian and South African pneumococcal trials. Since 2000, he has worked in at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, the Menzies School of Health Research in Darwin and Murdoch Children’s Research Institute.

During that time he has established pneumococcal research programs in Fiji, Mongolia and Vietnam. He has also worked extensively on pneumonia and has published a text book on Pneumonia in Children.
